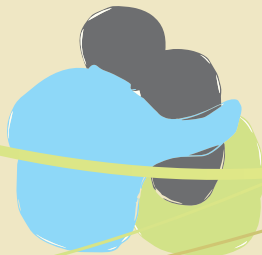

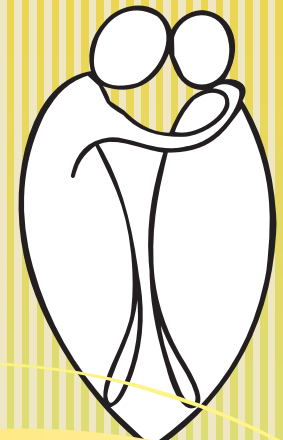

## Who are we:

We are a community based non-profit society dedicated to providing comfort, support services and resources to clients, families and friends dealing with end of life, experiencing loss, or bereavement.

We have expanded our services. In addition to our companioning visitors support for persons at end of life, we now include those living with a life-limiting illness. Volunteers provide companionship, comfort, encouragement and respite.

We offer palliative caregivers respite to help prevent burnout.

Services may be provided in hospital, a care facility or in a person's own home.

Referrals may be made by patients, families, friends, physicians, social workers or home nurses.

We assist with accessing medical equipment (hospital beds and over-bed tables).

We provide educational workshops, advocacy, and community awareness of issues about end-of-life care, self-care and palliative care.

We are supported by fundraising, membership dues, community donations and grants from BC Gaming and Northern Health Home & Community Care.
